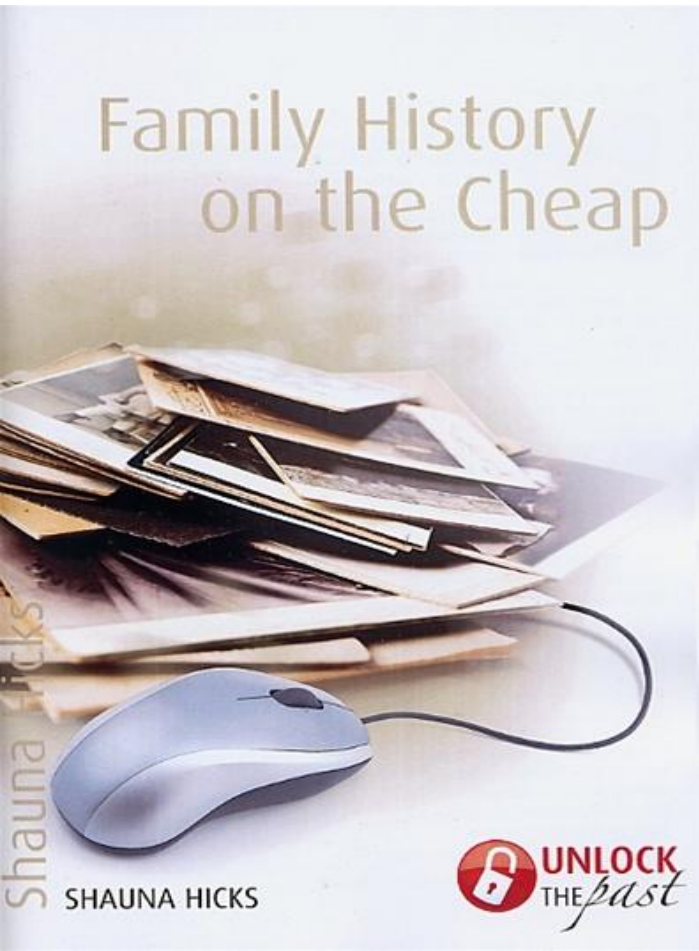

Variants

This study is registered for the variants Peplar, Peplow, Peplow, Pepler and Peplo. I also consider Pepelowe, Peplow, Peplor, Peplowe, and anything that has 2 P's separated by a vowel and followed by an L. I do rule out those names that end in 'ski' and Peplaus are on the fence.

Because there is such a variation even in the life events of a single individual, I have a tendency to refer to the name as Peplx. I am always surprised by the suffix .

About the Pepler One-Name Study

Like many others, I started researching one-name to find a missing ancestor.

I felt that if I collected all the Peplers into a big pile, sorted out the families and organized them, my Richard would float to the surface. After about five years and several thousand Peplers/Peplows, Richard emerged. It turned out that he was born a Peplow, married as a Pepler, appeared on the census as a Peplow again and died a Pepler.

The information I have found and the constructed families can be found on my Pepler Name website in the links section. There are pictures and stories from around the world that people have been generous enough to share with me. Major families groups are marked with small colored squares

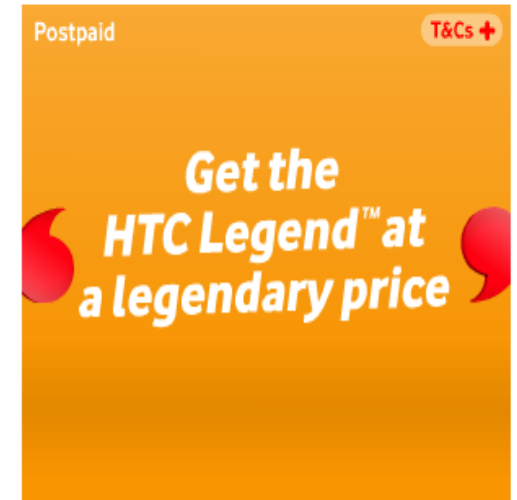

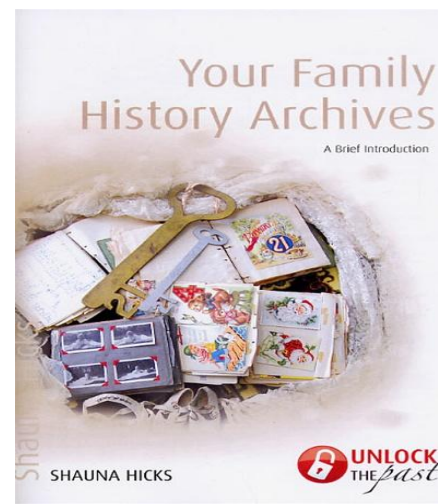

PERSONAL CONTINUITY PLAN

for Household/Personal Records

This document is intended as a guide for the maintenance and protection of personal records in the prevention of, or reduction in loss of important information should a disaster occur. It is intended for use by members of the general public regardless of record keeping experience.

There are many personal documents that can be considered important. A checklist has been provided for your convenience containing documents which are essential and documents which are important but not essential. Further to this are a number of suggestions for storing your personal records, these suggestions range in complexity and cost and it is up to the individual to choose the method which will best suit them and their personal situation, however in all cases some commitment is required to maintain the records to ensure you have current and complete documentation stored.

Personal Records Checklist

IDENTITY RECORDS

Copies (photocopy or scanned image) of these records will not be valid but will at least contain all of the necessary information to obtain replacements.

- Birth Certificates for each family member
- Marriage Certificate
- Certificate of Divorce
- Death Certificates
- Drivers Licences for each family member
- Passports for each family member

FAMILY RECORDS

Essential

- Insurance Policies
 - Vehicle/s – Cars, Boat, Caravan, etc
 - Personal liability
 - Property – House and House Contents
 - Specific Property eg Jewellery, Equipment
 - Life
 - Health
- Health Records or Physicians' names and addresses who have records of each family member.

Storage Suggestions for Safe Keeping of Family Information & Records

It is highly recommended that in every suggested scenario below a list of enclosed documents is included which specifies every document that should be in the box, folder, CD, etc. Particularly in the case of the archive box or concertina file should a document have been removed eg your son's birth certificate when he applied for his driver's license, and not replaced you will at least know that it is missing because a note was made of it on the list.

SCANNING

Essential records could be scanned and saved on a CD or DVD. With the exception of Identity Records in most cases an electronic copy is sufficient for proof. If you do not own a scanner there are companies who will scan your information for you for a reasonably low cost.

Make a couple of copies and keep them in separate locations for example keep one at home in a location that allows it to be grabbed quickly in an emergency and then another copy in one of the following:

1. Ask a trusted friend or relative to store one
2. Keep one in a safety deposit box
3. Keep a copy securely at work

SECURE BANK SERVICES

Essential records could be stored, for an annual fee, in a bank using a Safe Custody Service (packet storage) or in a Safe Deposit Box.

HARDCOPY RECORDS STORAGE

A simple and relatively inexpensive solution is to store your records at home in a safer way, such as:

- Keep important records together
- Store them in a custom polypropylene archive box (water resistant, mould retardant and being poly-propylene do not give off a toxic gas as the plastic breaks down which in turn damages the records)
- Store the archive box in a location which is within the main home, at least one metre (3 feet) off of the ground and can be easily accessed during an emergency evacuation of your home

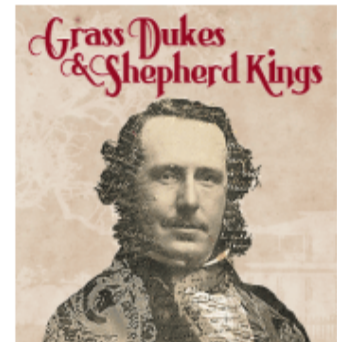

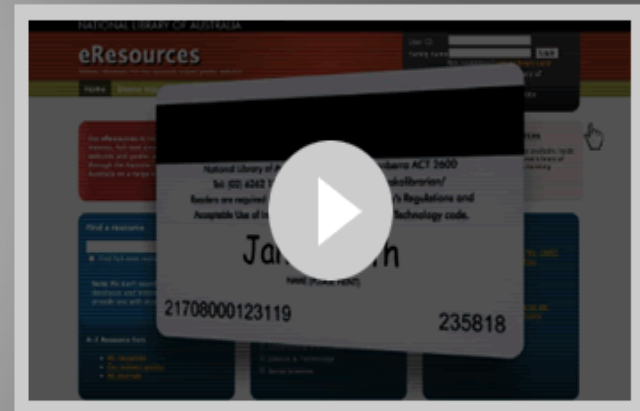

4. [1828 Census of New South Wales](#)

 This was the first New South Wales census. It was held in November 1828 and is the only census to survive in full to the present day. It aimed to record all the inhabitants of the colony at the time, and provides the individual's full name, age, place of residence, ship of arrival, occupation employer's name and place of residence

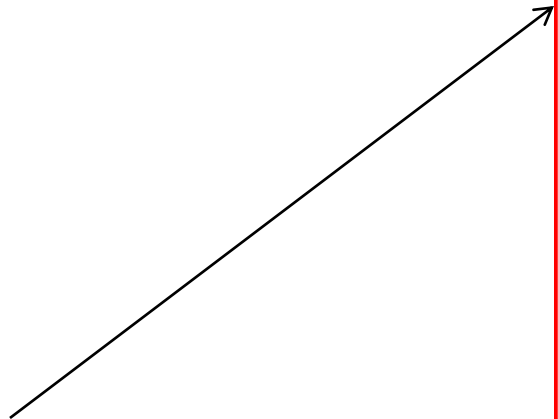

FreeUKGen is an initiative to help make more high quality primary (or near-primary) records of relevance to UK genealogy conveniently available online, preferably for free, in a coherent, easy to access and search, facility or set of facilities

FreeUKGen aims to provide the tools and support for its member projects (see below) and to do so in a way that makes good use of present knowledge about relevant computer science techniques, e.g. concerning interfaces, databases, data interchange protocols, and system design generally, and which is technically forward-looking.

FreeUKGen encourages large-scale volunteer effort, and makes good use of it, e.g. by reducing duplication of transcription and indexing efforts, and by facilitating widespread access to the information resources that are produced by such efforts.

FreeUKGen sets the standard for other organisations that are engaged in making genealogy resources available.

FreeUKGEN Projects



FreeBMD was the first of the FreeUKGen projects to launch. The searchable database first became available in January 1999, some five months after the ONS gave permission for the Project. Mocked at first as being "too big", it has proved all its doubters wrong, as it moves towards its target of completing the complete index at a faster rate than even the early fans thought possible.

We don't know if FreeBMD is the biggest voluntary transcription project ever, but we suspect it might be!



FreeCEN was the second of the FreeUKGen projects to come on-line. Transcription started in July 1999, and the online database launched in July 2003.

Since the launch of the search engine, a number of counties have been completed, and transcription is continuing at a rapid rate.



FreeREG was the third of the FreeUKGen projects to come on-line. Founded by Rod Neep (of Archive CD Books) in early 1999. The FreeREG search engine went live in September 2006.



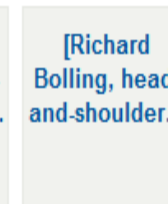

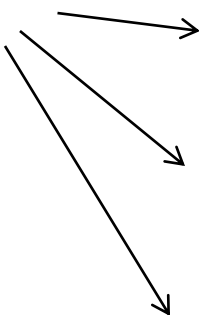

On Thursday an inquest was likewise held at the "Black Dog" public-house, Cambridge-street, Rocks, on the body of Richard Walker, who, the preceding morning, between 9 and 10 o'clock, fell to the earth in the yard at the back of the house in which he lived in the above street. He was carried to bed speechless, and remained in that state until about four o'clock the same day. The jury returned a verdict of—"Died by the visitation of God." In the course of the examination of witnesses, it appeared that a man of the name of Thomas Moshier, a poor cobbler living in the same house with deceased, went, between two and three o'clock, to the shop of Surgeon Hosking, and requested his attendance to the deceased, who had grown worse. Upon being informed that the applicant had no pecuniary means of remunerating him, Surgeon H. declined attending, alleging his "business would not permit him." At this conduct the jury, one and all, expressed their indignation in the severest terms language could convey; as it was their unanimous opinion, that had the assistance required been afforded to the individual now dead, in all probability he would have recovered; and this their opinion they requested the Coroner to represent through the proper medium.

To the Editor of the Sydney Gazette.

SIR,—I cannot allow the aspersion thrown out against my professional character in your report of the Coroner's inquest held on the body of *Richard Walker*, which appeared in your last *Gazette*, to pass without notice—especially as I consider no Coroner's Jury have a right to call in question the motives of any medical man for not doing what they may consider to be his duty.

In the first place, I have to state, that although the applicant had no pecuniary means of remunerating me, as stated at the inquest, had it been otherwise, I could not have gone at that time to visit the person, having but a few moments returned from a patient whom I could not have left for any length of time. Finding I was engaged, why could not the messenger have sought other medical assistance? and, moreover, it would have been useless had I gone, as I have heard since that the man was dead before he returned home.
