British Regiments in Australia

<u>Australia's Redcoat Settlers by B & M Chapman</u> This site features information on the British Regiments who served in Australia. Information is arranged by regiment with detailed biographical information on those who chose to settle here. There are 37,000+ soldiers named. The site also includes soldiers who served in Australia and settled in New Zealand.

White Ensign Southern Cross 1788-1913 This site is dedicated to the naval officers, men and their families who settled in Australia. This extensive site has detailed information on the Royal Marines, colonial navies, colonial defence, naval military actions and ships plus details of known descendants. A deserters database, compiled from government and police gazettes, is available online and lists deserters name, ship, source and details (physical description, age, height, deserted from etc).

<u>Land Forces of the British Empire by Stephen Luscombe</u> Here you will find resources for tracing military regiments and also histories of the various regiments. There is also a massive amount of information on the British Empire.

Military Regiments of the British Army A list of regiments that served in the Australian colonies by Graham Jaunay.

Society of Australian Genealogists - Index to Soldiers and Marines 1787-1830 A search returns name, rank, regiment, pay list/muster roll, reel/source and notes.

Chelsea Pensioners - Out Pensions This index by Grahame Thom covers 1849-1853 for New South Wales. Men pensioned out of the British Army were known as Chelsea Pensioners because their pensions were administered through the Royal Hospital Chelsea, a retirement and nursing home for former members of the British Army. Those who lived at the hospital were known as in-pensioners and those who lived elsewhere were known as out-pensioners. Most were out-pensioners and were registered in a district where the local pay office was located. Each district kept records of Chelsea pensioners from when they first registered in the district or transferred in until they transferred out or died. These records detail a soldier's career and can also provide information about next of kin. The original records are held by the Public Record Office London (War Office 22). They are available on film through the Australian Joint Copying Project (AJCP).

<u>Findmypast - Chelsea Pensioners Record Series War Office 97</u> These records relate to men pensioned out of the British Army 1760-1913. Pensions were administered through the Royal Hospital Chelsea hence the term Chelsea Pensioners. Most pensioned soldiers were out-





Records of Australian servicemen and women who served in World War I in the first Australian Imperial Force (AIF) are preserved in the National Archives. The collection of first AIF personnel dossiers includes records of service in the:

- First Australian Imperial Force (1st AIF)
- Australian Flying Corps (AFC) the predecessor of the RAAF
- Australian Naval and Military Expeditionary Force (AN&MEF) the combined force despatched in August 1914 to neutralise German New Guinea
- Royal Australian Naval Bridging Train (RANBT) formed to assist the landing of men and equipment from RAN vessels
- Australian Army Nursing Service (AANS)
- · Home or Depot units for personnel who served within Australia
- · non-combatants such as artists, photographers, chaplains and historians



Boer War Records

Queensland State Archives holds records relating to the six contingents of the Queensland Defence Force which fought in the Boer War from 1899 to 1902. Queensland units also fought in the Commonwealth Defence Force battalions after federation. Only a small number of records relating to the Queensland units of the Commonwealth battalions are held at Queensland State Archives.

1. Index to Military Service Records, 1899-1901

This index was compiled from Item ID 18351, Military service records.

This series (<u>ID 13032</u>) is a Queensland Defence Force record of service in South Africa. The records have been arranged by contingents numbered 1 to 6. Details listed for each entry include: rank and name, regimental number, company, marital status, period of service, casualties, discharge, medals, address, and other remarks (however in the majority of entries not all columns have been used).

For researchers looking for members of a particular contingent the table below lists each contingent, their arrivals and departures and the relevant pages in the register.

THE VOYAGE OF THE CORNWALL.

One of the members of the first contingent, writing to his wife in Queensland, gives the following interesting account of the voyage:—

At Sea, S.S. Cornwall, December 6. Here we are, plugging slong on the Cornwall, a good many miles still from South Africa. We have had very fair weathera few rough days, but generally fine and The ship is very steady, very good in rough weather, but, alas! she is dreadfully slow. We should run about 240 miles in each twenty-four hours, but she has only averaged a little over 200 miles since We shall, however, get to leaving Albany. Port Elizabeth by Saturday evening. Thank goodness, the voyage is nearly over. It has been very wearying, and we have had a terrible epidemic of influenza. I told you of that from Albany. Well, it has decreased considerably, but the sick parade each day is not less than from twenty to thirty men. At Albany we put ambore for hospital a young fellow named Wells, of He was formerly a blacksmith's assistant in the employment of Siemon, the bus proprietor at Toowong. I am sure that he would have died had we brought him on. Some of the cases have been very serious. Corporal Barker, who had pneumonia, is all right again ; in fact, he was out of danger at Albany. Private Hughes, of Townsville, had a very bad attack of influenza and neuralgia, but is now well and picking up Sergeant-major Loynes (instrucstrength. tor of the Ipswich company) was pretty bad There are dozens of others who have been bad, but I do not remember their names. You may depend that with all this sickness Captain Dods, who is in charge

of the medical department, has had his

hands pretty full.

at Capetown at last, and to go on to De Aar to-morrow. spell our horses at De Aar for some days. Everything in the way of our uniform is being altered. We are to wear khaki helmets instead of our hats and plumes, the reason given being (as told me by one of the officers) that the Boers feel very sorry poor Tommy Atkins who has to fight for a shilling a day, but are very bitter against all volunteers. Consequently, they shoot the men in the felt hate in preference to the "Tommies" in the helmets, and we are to circumvent the wily Boer by wearing khaki helmets! Another thing the same officer told me is this : Our officers are to leave their awords at the base and to carry, carbines. The idea is to puzzle the Boer as to who are officers and who are men. The officers have so far fared very badly, and the authorities are just waking to the fact that the same methods do not suit in all campaigns. We had a very bad gale between Port Elizabeth and Capetown, but did not lose any more horses

What is left of our famous compressed forage is to be sold. damaged by salt water has gone overboard. After all, the fuss about it, too ! We might just as well have left it in Brisbane. have not used more than six bags of grain since leaving Brisbane. It all shows that our "transport" service is not up to date. We have loaded the ship with grain and patent fodder which was not wanted, and has not been used. I hear that the officers presented Captain Barter and his officers with an address, and teasted them in good old-fashioned style. We "Tommies" would have liked to follow suit, for the captain and officers are a really good lot. rather rough not giving our horses a spell here, but I suppose they will get a spell at







Designed by Sir John Burnet, the principal architect of the Gallipoli cemeteries, it is a thick tapering pylon 14.3 metres high on a square base 12.98 metres wide. It is constructed from limestone mined at Ilgardere in Turkey. The Memorial commemorates the 3268 Australians and 456 New Zealanders who have no known grave and the 960 Australians and 252 New Zealanders who were buried at sea after evacuation through wounds or disease. The names of New Zealanders commemorated are inscribed on stone panels mounted on the south and north sides of the pylon, while those of the Australians are listed on a long wall of panels in front of the pylon and to either side. Names are arranged by unit and rank. The Memorial stands over the centre of the Turkish trenches and tunnels which were the scene of heavy fighting during the August offensive. Most cemeteries on Gallipoli contain relatively few marked graves, and the majority of Australians killed on Gallipoli are commemorated here.
