Brief Guide 39

This Brief Guide provides an overview of Queensland State Archives records relating to mental health patients. Prior to the separation from New South Wales in 1859, there were no facilities for psychiatric treatment in the Moreton Bay Region. As such, mentally disturbed persons, or "lunatics", would have been sent to Brisbane Gaol or possibly to an asylum in Sydney. Woogaroo Lunatic Asylum opened in 1865 with 69 patients, and has undergone many name changes and renovations since.

There are two main types of mental asylum records held at Queensland State Archives: Public Curator Insanity files and Goodna Case Books.

Public Curator insanity files

In general Public Curator insanity files held at Queensland State Archives consist of records of people who were admitted to the institutions in Goodna (Woogaroo), Ipswich (Sandy Gallop), or Toowoomba (Willowburn).

Background

Original correspondence sent to the Home Secretary regarding the admission and discharge of patients to the Roma and Dalby Sanatoriums for Phthisis (also known as Consumption or Pulmonary Tuberculosis) from 1897 to 1902 can be found in <u>Series ID 8400, Special Batches</u>, Letters detail medical assessments of the patients and accommodation as well as travelling allowances.

Does your family history have someone who 'vanished'? If you cannot find a death certificate or if children were raised by someone other than a parent, check mental asylum records. Reasons for admission included epilepsy, head injury, alcoholism, birth defects and depression (especially post-natal depression). Many patients (adults and children) spent only a few days in an asylum, and descendants would be unaware of that.

'Public Curator insanity files' (which are only closed for 75 years from the date of the last document in the file) are different from 'case books'. These insanity files are mainly about getting someone to pay for the patient's maintenance, so they often have superb information about the patient's relatives.

Qld State Archives hold Public Curator insanity files for people admitted to mental asylums at Goodna (Woogaroo / Wolston Park), Toowoomba (Willowburn) and Ipswich (Sandy Gallop). The size and contents of these files vary, but they usually give **dates** of admission and discharge or death, and many include **letters** from the patient or his/her relatives, and sometimes **police reports, certificates, wills, divorce details, lists of property**, etc. Information about **relatives** may include addresses, biographical data, children, employment history, property, financial and social circumstances, etc.

Qld State Archives have a printed **index to old insanity files c1865-1893**, and (arranged only by first letter of surname) a **register of insanity files up to 1918** and an **index to insanity files 1919-c1945**. Names below are from my index to the 'register up to 1918', which has some details for patients whose file is missing.

Brief administrative history

Function of government

One of the functions of Government, overtime, has been to provide care for the poor and infirm as part of social and community services. More detail on the history of the Government function of social and community services can be found in Archives Investigator. By choosing the advanced search option you can search for function 4 -Social and community services.

Care for the poor and infirm is not the same as care provided as part of mental health programs. For records relating to mental health patients please see Archives in Brief 85.

The Benevolent Society

Before 1862 care for the infirm and destitute was primarily provided by non-government organisations. The Benevolent Society, founded in 1813, opened the first asylum for the poor, blind, aged and infirm in 1821 on the site of Central Railway Station.

Roberts, Sarah Ann, aged 34, native of Manchester; arrived in 1857; died January 9, of peritonitis. Rogers, Henry, aged 10, native of Lancashire; arrived in 1868, in Naval Reserve; died January 13, of diphtheria.

Shaw, Ann, aged 35, native of Ireland; arrived in 1860, in Merlin; died January 4, of pneumonia. Sullivan, Jane, aged 54, native of England; died January 3, of pneumonia.

Tansen, Christian, aged 26, native of Denmark; arrived in 1877 in Sarah Ann; died January 6, of phthisis. Thomas, Mary, aged 36, native of Ireland; arrived in 1855 in Queen of the Seas; died December 20, of pneumonia. Thorne, Marion, aged 34, native of Herefordshire; arrived in 1870 in Bombay; died December 30, of entiritis. Tierney, Mary, aged 38, native of Ireland; arrived in 1864 in Marco Polo; died December 20, of phthisis. Truby, Stephen, aged 58, native of London; arrived in 1853, in Jane Francis; died January 11, of dilatation of the heart.



Darragh index

The <u>Darragh index</u> is an invaluable resource for anyone interested in locating Germans living in Melbourne between 1861 and 1924.

Comprising over 1200 names, with a further 640 names of wives, children and parents appearing within most entries, this index was compiled using the Melbourne German Sick and Relief Society's archival records held at the State Library of Victoria. This collection consists of minute books, membership records, financial records, published histories of the Society, photographs and various documents concerning friendly societies.

In addition to the name and date of joining, or date of nomination if unsuccessful, there is also information about marital status on joining, occupation, date and place of birth, date of death, date of leaving, address at the time of joining, date of arrival in Victoria and on what ship.

The Melbourne German Sick and Relief Society, or Deutscher Krankenverein, was founded in 1861. It provided sickness and death benefits to members and also supported members and others who were needy or out of work. The



Destitute Asylum



In April 1851 the government granted the Destitute Board access to part of the barracks complex next to Government House on North Terrace. The destitute moved into their new quarters on 10th May 1851. It became the Destitute Asylum and a place where the aged, poor and chronically sick were looked after and kept alive. The Asylum was not abandoned

until 1917.

Destitute Asylum 1850's - 1860's

The term 'asylum' was often used in the early nineteenth century, in England, the United States and Australia. It referred to the use of a building or group of buildings where institutional care was provided. The asylum allowed regularity, supervision and control. It provided economies of scale and was the most efficient way of handling those who were socially dependent. Consequently, the Destitute Asylum provided institutional care for women, children, the aged, destitute and the sick. During the 1850's and 1860's the Asylum's occupancy of the barracks expanded.

The building was repaired and wings added to accommodate the increasing number of residents. In 1863 an Act was passed for the 'Regulation of the Destitute Asylum' to better regulate the government's aid to the destitute and sick. It also


