





Description

The word 'gazetteer' means 'a geographic dictionary or index', which is very appropriate for all 'Bailliere's' titles, as they are primarily an alphabetical listing of all places (large and small), together with geographical information and physical features.

Compiled over a period of 13 years by Robert P. Whitworth, and published by F.F. Bailliere in Melbourne, this series of Australian Gazetteers is ideal for researchers of Australian history, when trying to locate either small towns or regions, or ones that may have changed name.

Bailliere's Gazetteers were compiled for most colonies in Australia during the 19th century. They generally contain the following:

- The most recent and accurate information (at publication date) for every township, village, hamlet, river, creek, mountain, lake, gold field, road and railway
 with its botanical, geological, and physical features.
- . The division of the colony into counties, and electoral, council, pastoral, and municipal districts and hundreds with their boundaries and statistics.
- The names, areas, occupiers, positions, rentals, new valuations and grazing capabilities of the squatting stations with the best means of reaching them.
- Particulars of the coast survey, statistics of the ports, manufactures, and agricultural, pastoral, and mining pursuits, census of dwellings and population, areas
 in acreage and miles and comprehensive and correct electoral, municipal, district council and police information.
- A complete road itinerary, showing the easiest, most expeditious, and cheapest method of transit and conveyance of goods to and from every place in the
 colony by rail, coach, boat, dray or horse.

NEW NORFOLK (Co. Buckingham) is a rural municipality (proclaimed Feb. 13th, 1863,) in the Legislative Council electoral district of Derwent, and Legislative Assembly electoral district of New Norfolk. It has an area of 240,000 acres, and a population, by the last census, of 2,952. The net annual value of rateable property is £13,878. The principal townships of the municipality are New Norfolk, Glenora, and Lachlan. There are pounds at New Norfolk, the Falls, Bridgewater, and Glenora; and public schools at New Norfolk, Falls, Glenora, and River Plenty. The district is famed for its hop gardens. A coach runs to and from Hobart Town daily, and a steamer (the Monarch) along the Lower Derwent 5 times a week in summer and 3 times a week in winter. A conveyance runs daily to and from Glenora, and one 3 times a week to and from Hamilton. The agricultural statistics for the year ending March 31st, 1876, show :—Wheat, 1,001 acres, 18,917 bushels; barley, 144 acres, 4,654 bushels; oats, 449 acres, 13,575 bushels; peas, 175 acres, 3,813 bushels; beans, 85 acres, 2,194 bushels; tares, 12 acres, 288 bushels; potatoes, 219 acres, 792 tons; turnips, 52 acres, 440 tons; carrots, 18 acres, 223 tons; mangel wurzel, 141 acres, 2,216 tons; artificial grass seed, 60 acres, 823 bushels; hay, 2,001 acres, 2,776 tons; hops, 477 acres, 1,032,682 Ibs. ; gardens and orchards, 324 ; apples, 10,630 bushels ; peas, 645 bushels ; green forage, 55 acres; permanent artificial grass, 791 acres; fallow, 282 acres; total land in cultivation, 6,300 acres; new land broken up, 134 acres; under rotation of crop, 4,324 acres; horses, 688; horned cattle, 1,952; sheep, 33,696; goats, 50 ; pigs, 2007 ; manufactories and trades carried on, 85.

NEW NORFOLK is a S. electoral Assembly district bounded on the north by Russell's Falls from its source to the River Derwent, thence by that river to the west angle of a grant to John Terry on the left bank of the River Derwent, by the north-west and north-east boundaries of that grant to the Belmont Rivulet, thence by the division boundaries of the parishes of Grafton and Lansdowne to Platform Bluff on the Dromedary Range, on the north-east by the Dromedary Range and Dromedary Creek to its junction with the River Derwent, thence by that river to the electoral district of Glenorchy, on the south-east by that district to the electoral district of Kingborough, and by that district to the point of commencement. The polling places are at the Court House, New Norfolk, and the Styx bridge. The district is represented by Alex, Riddoch, and has 311 electors, and a population of 2,952 persons.

NEW NORFOLK ROAD (Co. Buckingham) is a railway station on the main line $12\frac{1}{4}$ miles from Hobart Town, and $120\frac{1}{4}$ miles from Launceston.

However, the Battye Library also holds newspapers, photographs, film and video, maps, oral history interviews, ephemera and Australian Joint Copying Project microfilm, all of which can have information of interest to the genealogical researcher. Some newspapers, oral history interviews and ephemera have been indexed for biographical information, while photographs can either be found online or through a card catalogue (see Photographs of People for further details).



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Maps

Some <u>maps</u> may be of use to the genealogist. Various series of land ownership maps have been published by the Lands and Surveys Department (now Landgate). The chain series is a series of maps in different scales - <u>20</u>, <u>40</u>, <u>80</u>, <u>240</u>, <u>300</u> and <u>800</u> chain. It is available in several editions and shows the changing patterns of land ownership from 1900 to the 1960's. The whole state is covered and an index map exists. Other <u>archival map series</u> relating to land are held at the State Records Office.



An earlier series of maps (ex $\underline{298C}$, now 45/9-16) was commenced by the Lands and Surveys Department in about 1880 with an S and C series for the Southern and Central areas on an 80 chain scale. This was followed by an M, G and K series for the Murchison, Gascoyne and Kimberley districts respectively on a 300 chain scale. There is also a miscellaneous L series and an index map for the series which covers most of the state. The \underline{S} , \underline{C} , \underline{G} & \underline{K} , \underline{M} and \underline{L} series are now all available online.

The <u>cancelled public plans</u> of the Lands and Surveys Department (see CN 77 for listing) also provide information on the opening up of land in certain districts and localities.

These map series may provide names of people owning or leasing land, acreage, location or lease numbers, dates etc.

Other maps may be useful for tracing landowners, eg real estate plans (78C on aperture cards, see CN 1 for listing; 101C103C on aperture cards, see CN 3 for listing), **Post Office Directory** maps and the townsite map series (ex 211C) which will give background information on land and often valuable dates for settlement. The townsite map series has been individually catalogued, so to locate a plan of a particular town, simply enter the name of the town and the word townsite in the keyword option of a map search. Map reference numbers can be located in the online catalogue.

Background to the maps

In 1825 Royal Instructions were issued to Governor Brisbane ordering a general survey of the colony of New South Wales and its division into counties and parishes. County and parish maps have been used for over 150 years to record Crown land dealings.

Two sets of county, parish and town/village maps were created and maintained by the Department of Lands and its predecessors. One set of maps, for a particular area, was kept at the Local or District offices and a duplicate set for the whole State was kept in the Head Office of the Department.

Maps

Australian maps, especially those covering Victoria, are the main focus of this collection, though the Library also has many maps from overseas.

As well as over 110,000 maps - enough to carpet metropolitan Melbourne - the collection includes geographical and cartographic reference books and atlases.

There is a wealth of rare and antique maps in the collection, including maps showing the first outlines of the Australian coast, charts by Matthew Flinders and early Dutch maps. The 19th-century township, parish, county and squatting maps can provide all sorts of leads for those investigating their family history.


Drainage plans produced by the <u>Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works</u> (MMBW) from the late 19th century to the 1940s give a fascinating historical record of Melbourne streetscapes and features.

There are several thousand <u>auction plans</u> showing the layout of suburban estates, and large collections of <u>fire insurance plans</u>, aerial photographs, geological and goldmining maps, as well as topographic maps from government agencies such as Land Victoria and GeoScience Australia.

Significant overseas holdings include maps by the British Ordnance Survey, nautical charts covering all corners of the globe, and 19th-century maps of India.

Over 25,000 maps and plans have been digitised and made available online through our <u>catalogue</u>, including the majority of our historical Victorian county and parish maps, MMBW, auction, and fire insurance plans.

The Library's map collection is held in storage and can be viewed by <u>contacting</u>
<u>Library staff</u> to arrange an appointment in the Heritage Collections Reading
Room.



14.1 COLONIAL MAPS OF HOBART TOWN

In 1841 James Sprent produced a detailed survey of Hobart Town, including the outlines of many buildings. The maps have been scanned and incorporated into the 'LIST MAP' - the Tasmanian Government's on-line spatial mapping facility: www.thelist.tas.gov.au Site.

- Genmaps have put online a variety of Wiltshire maps from 1610 to 1911.
- Clear, Large Type and Braille Maps.

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
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Tithe and enclosure maps

Tithe and enclosure records are important as one of the few sources of largescale, systematic mapping of England and Wales. The original, manuscript tithe maps (mostly c.1836) are generally held in the National Archives or local record offices, with the British Library owning very few. Some tithe maps have been digitised and made available online.

All tithe and enclosure maps show dwellings and give details of property owners, and so are useful for historical research. They do not cover all of England or Wales, and are variable in quality and scale, however. The National Archive's Domestic Information Research Guide 41, <u>Tithe Records</u>, contains a short history and description of tithe maps in England and Wales.

The British Library owns very few tithe maps, in the counties of Essex, Wiltshire, and Somerset. All may be found on Explore the British Library by searching for "tithe" and limiting the date to 1836-1860 in the cartographic materials subset.

Tithe and Enclosure Maps Online

England - Counties

Some counties and council record offices have scanned their map holdings and made them available online, but the majority have information on their web pages about what is held and how to access the records and maps. For counties that do not appear on the list, contact The National Archives or the relevant county record office.

<u>Bedfordshire Tithe records</u>: No maps online. Information about Bedfordshire tithe records and listing of conspectus parishes.

<u>Buckinghamshire Tithe Maps</u>: No maps online. Information about Buckinghamshire's enclosure and tithe Maps. Enclosure map of the Parish of Sherington in the county of Buckinghamshire is <u>online</u>.

<u>Cambridgeshire Archives</u>: No maps online. Lists, in pdf, of tithe maps and apportionments in the county record offices of Cambridgeshire and Huntingdon.

<u>Cheshire's Tithe Maps Online</u>: Almost 500 Cheshire tithe maps are now available online. Together with the information recorded in tithe apportionments, they are a unique record of land ownership, occupancy and use in Cheshire 150 years ago.

<u>Cornwall Tithe project</u>: No maps currently online, though digitisation is underway and materials are meant to be available on the web in 2011. CD-ROMs of maps and apportionments may be purchased online.

Cumbria: A database of tithe map entries for the <u>Bampton Tithe Map of</u>
<u>1838-9</u>, in the Eden District of Cumbria, was created and is available online. The map itself is not online.

<u>Derbyshire Tithe Maps</u>: No maps online. Information about the tithe maps on Derbyshire. For the area of <u>Lower Dove</u>, (over the Derbyshire/Staffordshire border) tithe maps of 17 of the 32 townships are available.

<u>Devon Tithe Records</u>: For the district of East Devon, 36 of the 1840 tithe maps, covering all 29 parishes of current-day East Devon, have been digitised and are available via <u>Parishscapes</u>. The <u>Modbury Tithe</u> <u>Map (1841)</u> is a digitised copy of the large - 6ft x 4ft - map portraying



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Tithe Digitisation

Cornwall Record Office (CRO) holds around 200 parish and town tithe maps and the accompanying survey books (apportionments), dating from c1840. These documents provide a fascinating snap-shot of land use and ownership in the 19th century and can be useful for local, industrial, property and family history studies. The maps include boundaries of fields, woods, roads and rivers and locations of buildings. They follow old parish boundaries and are usually large scale. The apportionments give



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details of who owned and occupied land or properties, and what the land was used for.

Frequent use of the already fragile maps has taken its toll on the collection and some are now unfit for use due to their poor condition, and access to all is restricted to on-site visits to the CRO. In order to preserve the documents and improve access to them, we have undertaken a project to digitise the maps and survey books in conjunction with parish, town and district councils

Eventually, we plan to make the images and accompanying databases of information available on-line. In the meantime, they are available as CDROM packages for purchase or use at the Record Office or Cornish Studies Library.


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
