What is the AJCP?

- Possibly one of the longest running projects in the world
- Over 10,000 reels of microfilmed records dating from 1560–1984
- Thousands of classes of records & collections relevant to Australia, New Zealand & Pacific
- Hundreds of archives, libraries, museums, organisations and private hands

Brief History of the AJCP

- Started in 1945, last reel received 1997
- Agreement between NLA and SLNSW to copy material held in the UK relevant to Australia and the Pacific (1945–1988, then with SLV, National Library NZ, National Archives NZ and several university libraries)
- ▶ 1945–1960 material held PRO UK now NA UK
- 1960 –1997material held in British Library, National Libraries of Scotland, Ireland & Wales, university libraries, museums, etc

Records of transportees to Australia (1787-1879)

Search convict <u>censuses</u>, <u>musters</u>, <u>pardons and tickets of leave</u> (including HO 10, HO 11 and CO 209/7) on Ancestry.com.au (<u>£</u>).

The 1828 New South Wales census, (HO 10/21-27), is the most complete. Often you can find:

- biographical information
- whether each settler came free or as a convict, or was born in the colony
- the ship name and the year of arrival

HO 10 also contains material about convicts' pardons and tickets of leave from New South Wales and Tasmania, 1834-59.



About the project

The ADM 101 series consists of journals and diaries compiled by Royal Navy surgeons and assistant surgeons who served on HM ships, hospitals, naval brigades, shore parties and on emigrant and convict ships in the period 1793 to 1880.

Medical officers serving in the Royal Navy were required to submit detailed records of the health, treatment and survival rates of their charges. This has provided us with journals which exhibit a completeness, consistency and coherence unlikely to exist elsewhere for this period.

In June 2008, The National Archives was successful in its bid for a grant under the Wellcome Trust's Research Resources in Medical History programme, to catalogue the journals. The key objective of this funded project was to open up this under-utilised resource for researchers by fully cataloguing over a thousand journals.

As a result of this extensive work the records can be easily searched by the name of the medical officer, the patient, the ship or even by disease or ailment. The cataloguing also revealed some unexpected 'bonus' material contained in the journals. For example, the presence of watercolour illustrations, sketches, hand-drawn maps, charts showing details of the climate, details about the lay-out of the vessels and ideas about ventilation, and details of the countries visited and people encountered.



About UK Royal Navy Medical Journals, 1817-1857

This database contains indexed images of medical journals from 19th-century British ships, which include names of patients and other passengers and crew aboard.

The journals in this database were kept by ships' medical officers, who were required to keep a record of patients, treatments, and outcomes during a voyage. This collection includes 671 volumes, each from a single ship and covering a particular time period. The majority are convict ships bound for Australia or Van Diemen's Land.

The journals list names, ages, "quality" (the patient's rank or status aboard), diseases, duration dates, and notes on symptoms and treatment. They often include daily sick lists extracted from the journal pages as well. Researchers should not forget their female ancestors. Some convict ships sailing to Australia were designated for female convicts; other women emigrated voluntarily.

These records are valuable for family history research on several fronts. First, they list names of sick (and others who may have come to the surgeon's attention) among passengers, convicts, and crew. These may include passengers who did not recover and so never made it to their destination. They also offer fascinating details on contemporary treatments and medical practices, as well as stories of life aboard ship, from the perils (and prevalence) of grog-related accidents to a simple chronicle of the daily routine on a 19th-century sailing vessel.



The records relate to convicts held in British prison hulks Cumberland, Dolphin and Ganymede. Hulks were ships used as floating prisons, often when they were no longer fit for battle but were still afloat.

There are records of 17,644 prisoners for the period 1818-1831.

It's possible to find out the following about your ancestors from these records:

- Number
- · Address and where born
- · Physical description: height, complexion, make, visage, eye and hair colour
- · Married or single
- Offence

Prison ship (Hulk) registers

Search records for around 8,900 prisoners held on prison ships between 1811 and 1843. Prison ships, or hulks, were ships used as floating prisons — often ships were used that were no longer fit for battle although they were still able to float.

This collection of records includes details of prisoners on the following hulks: Bellerophon, Euryalus, Hardy and Antelope, as well as a small number of records for Parkhurst prison.

You may find that your ancestors appear in more than one hulk as they could have been transferred from one hulk to another.

Indexes, Transcripts & Original Records/Digitised Images

- Be wary of indexes done by people
- Always note original source reference
- If no source reference, how do you know what it refers to
- Always look at original document for more information and to check accuracy of index or transcript

Conclusion

- Still not the easiest source to use
- Definitely supplements colonial convict and military records
- Can lead into newspapers and other sources eg Colonial Secretary Office records in the various State Archives
- Remember it's not all online!
