


The Faith of Pioneers Justified

(By the REV. H. A. DENNY, Superintendent Minister)

In a little threepenny exercise book, the front page yellow with age, but well preserved, written in plain characters, is contained the record of a resolution, the issues of which are imperishable, since they are transcribed in the spiritual experiences of countless lives who have enjoyed the ministry of the Sherwood Church during the past fifty years. The writing on the page is as follows:—

"On Friday evening, October 8, 1886, and within the house of Mr. Thomas Johnston, a meeting was held according to appointment at 7.30 o'clock, the object for which it was held was to ascertain what steps be taken if possible to start a new place of worship in the district, the same to be immediately connected with the Wesleyan Methodist Church, and attached to the South Brisbane Circuit of that church."

Mr. Payne being called to preside, the meeting was opened by devotional exercises. After

Rainworth was begun in a small way, the church being removed from Laidley Creek. Recently improvements have been made to the building.

ANNALS OF ACHIEVEMENT

The oldest church in the Indooroopilly Circuit is situated at Brookfield. The first services were held in the home of Mr. and Mrs. Laws, Mrs. Laws starting a Sunday school in 1869.

Revs. W. Woolcock and B. Rounsefell, Bible Christians, were the first ministers. Mr. Barnett gave three acres of land and a church was built. The building became too small for the congregations and the present church was erected, the old building being removed to the recreation ground, where it is used as a public hall.

The Indooroopilly church dates from 1872, and owes its origin to the activities of a Primitive Methodist minister, Rev. Joseph Buckle, whose relatives, Mrs. J. Buckle and daughter Muriel, are now active workers. Five acres of land were purchased from the Government and the chief workers for the erection of the church were Messrs. J. Graham, J. Russell and J. Frost. Later, land was acquired in Moggill Road and a church and parsonage were erected. During the 1914-1918 war, land was secured at the corner of Station and Musgrave Roads and the Anzac Memorial Church, a fine brick building, was built in 1919. The parsonage in Grosvenor Road was built in 1926 and the hall in 1930. The present church was built by Mr. John Bradley, who though now eighty-seven still attends the church, and his daughter is the organist. The church at Chapel Hill was built by the Primitives in 1874. A cemetery is attached to this church. Church workers through the years have included Messrs. E. E. Richards, J. Graham, J. Bradley, E. Ferriday and Mesdames A. Jones and J. Pryde.

The Taringa church has the largest membership in the circuit. The first Primitive Methodist Church was built in Montrose Road in 1887. The present building was erected by Mr. John Bradley in 1898, who incorporated the original building in the new structure. In early years it was part of the Albert Street Circuit and later it was associated with Toowong. The Sunday school, now under the superintendency of Mr. C. C. Clifford, is one of the largest in Queensland. A prayer meeting is held every Sunday night after the church service.

The land on which the Toowong Reach church is built in

Ryan Road, was given by the "Courier-Mail" proprietors on condition that it be named the Toowong Reach Church. The building was opened in May 1915, one of the principal workers being Mrs. D. Guyatt. Messrs. J. Wagner and David Guyatt were secretary and treasurer of the trust respectively, and Mrs. A. Hess the organist.

In January 1946, Mr. H. S. Gresham, of Chelmer, gave a block of land to the Church at *Upper Brookfield*. A good Sunday school and Band of Hope, both conducted by Miss D. Dart, have been commenced and monthly services are held.

The earliest minute book of this church records the following: "On Friday evening, October 8th, 1886, and within the house of Mr. Thomas Johnston, a meeting was held according to appointment at 7.30 o'clock, the object of which was to ascertain what steps be taken, if possible, to start a new place of worship in the district, the same to be immediately connected with the Wesleyan Methodist Church and attached to the South Brisbane Circuit of that Church."

Mr. T. Payne, affectionately known as "Father Payne," a loyal member of the Methodist Church, was the chairman of this meeting. The Revs. Halse Rogers and B. Dinning were present and advised that land be secured for church purposes. A committee was appointed whose duty it was to take the necessary steps to carry out the decisions of the meeting. This committee comprised Thomas Payne, O. Judd, A. E. Appleton, T. Johnston, W. Wood, T. G. Johnston, J. Johnston, W. Warnes and J. Shanks. It was decided to commence a Sunday school at once, Mr. J. Shanks being appointed superintendent.

Before a month had passed a hall had been secured, at a rental of £4 per annum, in which to hold services and a Sunday school, and one meeting each week, presumably a class meeting. The opening Sunday was October 24th, 1886, when the response was most gratifying and encouraging. Shortly after this it was decided to build a church. In May 1887, the contract of Mr. T. Johnston to build a church for £120 was accepted. It was a small building, twenty-two feet long and twenty feet wide. The opening took place on September 4th amid much enthusiasm.

In 1903 Sherwood became a circuit and proposals were con-

enjoying greater facilities for his work. May the Lord confirm the Word with signs following. In your next issue we hope to announce the opening services of our new church, and shall be glad to see many friends on that occasion.

Toowoomba.—In July last, Sunday evening cottage services were commenced on the Newtown Estate-a new and rising suburb just beyond the western boundary of Toowoomba. The services have been conducted by brethren from the Herries-street Church, and have been continued with much encouragement. A short time ago two quarter-allotments were purchased, and the erection of a small church was commenced; this new building was opened on 22nd February. It is a neat and comfortable structure, 28 feet by 16 feet, the exterior of weatherboards, the interior lined throughout with pine. The proceedings began with a well-attended tea meeting after which the Church was somewhat uncomfortably crowded many having to stand the whole time. The Rev. W. Higlett occupied the chair and gave a short account of the steps which led to the erection of the church, and of the lines upon which it was intended to be worked in future. Mr. T. S. Burstow said that the cost of land and building had been about £160. Several brethren had given time and labour towards its erection, and that could not well be reduced to figures. Part of the money needful had been borrowed, part had been collected, and the balance was a debt for building materials. The remainder of the evening was devoted to singing, with the exception of a short address from Mr. George Anderson. There was a strong choir present under the leadership of Mr. D. Broadfoot, and several solos were well rendered and fully appreciated. The meeting throughout was of a most successful nature. On Sunday, 27th February, a special afternoon service was held. The church was comfortably filled, and an appropriate sermon was preached by the Rev. W. Higlett, who also conducted the usual evening service. This latest addition to the preaching stations of the Toowoomba Church promises to be one of the most important. Indeed it is more than possible that in years to come, if Toowoomba increases in size and the population as usual drifts to the suburbs, the Newtown Estate Church may become even more important than the






DEATH OF AN OXLEY PIONEER.

On Wednesday night, June 2, passed away on his 80th buthday one of the oldest residents of the Oxley district in the person of Mr. Thomas Johnston. With his wife he arrived in Moreton Bay on July 8, 1559, and settled for a time at 6-M le Rock. From there he removed to what is now called Sherwood in 1964. He took an active part in the L.O.L. for many years, holding all the prominent offices in connection with that order. He was closely identified with the Church. acting as local preacher. Sunday school superintendent and teacher, and was warm advocate of the temperance cause. He was born at Knockbrade, Cavan, Ireland. The cause of his death was a very serious operation, from which he never seemed to rally. During his long stay in the neighbourhood of Sherwood he gained the high esteem of a large circle of friends, evidence of this being given by the large numbers of attendants who saw him laid to rest in the Sherwood Presbyterian Church Cemetery. The services were conducted at the house and cemetery by the Reva. J. S. Pollock and Wra, Little. Mr. Johnston had live some and nine daughters. He lived to see twelve married. Sixty-one grandchildren and five great-grandchildren survive him.

Before civil registration commenced, church records of baptisms, marriages and burials are the main means of tracking the major life events. These records can also supplement or substitute for missing civil records.

While initial records were those of the Church of England chaplains, individuals with other religious affiliations will also often be found in these early records. From the introduction of civil registration of births, deaths and marriages in New South Wales on 31 March 1856 researchers can often find at least two records of the one event: · a church record of a baptism as well as the civil birth registration; · a church record of a burial as well as the civil death registration; and

Joint Copy Project

The early church registrations now held by the Registry of Births, Deaths and Marriages are not the originals, but are returns sent to it at a later date. Because of the risks of mistake or omission in the copying process, the original church registers are always worth checking. These registers remain with the relevant church authorities, and for more than 25 years SAG has been working with the National Library of Australia and the Mitchell Library to microfilm them and make them available to researchers at these three repositories.

Most inner-Sydney churches have been filmed, as have all registers of the Anglican Diocese of Canberra and Goulburn. Many Roman Catholic and Presbyterian registers have also been microfilmed. A cut-off date of about 1940 has been applied to many of these registers for privacy reasons.



During the history of the Diocese, the churches below have been closed. A Parish Council may deem the closure of a church necessary for reasons such as:

- · the congregation may have decreased;
- · the land may have been resumed by a civil authority; or
- · the building may no longer meet the needs of the Parish.

The Parish Council, having made a decision on closure, must hold a public meeting followed by a meeting of parishioners at which the decision is considered. Application is then made to the Archbishop for the closure of the Church and the removal of its dedication. If the closure is approved by the Church authorities, a closing service is usually held in the Church. At this service, the Petition is presented, the Deed of Closure is read and the dedication of the building is formally removed.






