Queensland State Archives holds many of the nineteenth and early to mid twentieth century records about education in Queensland government schools. This brief guide provides an overview of education records held at the Queensland State Archives.

The records refer mainly to State schools (primary and high schools), state rural schools and there are some departmental records about grammar, mission and church or non-vested schools. There are many series of records useful for compiling school histories. Few records of non vested schools (private schools) are at Queensland State Archives.

Primary Education

National: Four National schools were in operation prior to separation from New South Wales in 1859. National schools were proposed in New South Wales in 1848 and were based on the Irish National school system. The first National school was established at Toolburra near Warwick in 1850. (See also Vested and Normal).

Vested and non-vested: Vested or national schools were those whose property were vested in the Board of Education (1860-1875), and therefore came directly under the supervision of the Board. Fees were charged until 1870. Vested or National schools became State schools in 1875. Non-vested schools were those whose property and control were in the hands of various church groups

Background

The Board of General Education came into being in 1860 and was responsible for education in Queensland. At some time about 1870, details concerning teachers were copied into two registers, one for males and one for females (EDB/O1 - EDB/O2). The registers provide a succinct record of the teachers' careers. The index from the Board of General Education registers (EDB/O1-2) has been included because there is sometimes not a corresponding page in the register. The index gives brief information about each teacher.

The index at the front of each of these registers appears to be a list of all teachers who had taught for the Board. It is possible for one teacher to be listed in this index three times. Entries would be in the index, and in each series of registers.

Letters from promoters of schools concern the site, building, teacher and a variety of other matters. Inspectors' reports deal with the prospects of the district and the viability of the proposed school, and contain recommendations relating to the site, the permanent building and if necessary the temporary building, teachers, etc.

Letters and memoranda deal with changes in the schools status, closures and re-openings, and the adequacy of the site and buildings (ranging from routine repairs to new buildings). Valuable information on the progress of the

Education, Health and Welfare – Education Records

Prior to 1872 religious/denominational schools were maintained separately from government schools. The Denominational School Board provided for denominational schools and the National School Board, later the Board of Education, provided government sponsored secular education. In 1872, following growing dissatisfaction with State aid to religious schools and the burgeoning cost of funding and administering a dual school system, the government introduced free, compulsory and secular education and established the first Education Department. The Department became the employer of government teachers and Victoria had a Minister for Education. State aid to denominational schools ended in 1874.

Corporal punishment registers were kept by the head teacher of each school and record all corporal punishment administered by the head Teacher or an assistant (authorised by the minister).

The corporal punishment register contains the following information for each entry: date, name of the pupil or pupils receiving corporal punishment, fault or incident requiring punishment and the kind and extent of punishment.

Corporal punishment was to be administered not for trivial breaches of school discipline, but rather only as a last resort when the student had committed offences against morality, gross impertinence, and/or wilful and persistent disobedience. Girls over the age of twelve were not to receive corporal punishment.



Calico Creek State School



The Calico Creek School, which was opened officially on Saturday the 11th July 1936 by Councillor Hensen of Widgee Shire, was a one-teacher school. Calico Creek area had been a soldier settlement after World War 1 and the children of the settlers attended Lagoon Pocket School for 5 years until a census of the district showed a list of 23 pupils in the area.

The first School Committee, headed by Mr H. Atherton, applied for a school, pointing out to the department the expense of transporting the Calico Creek pupils to Lagoon Pocket.

The school, to accommodate 40 pupils, was 5.5m x 6.4m (18ft x 21ft) with verandas 2.5m (8ft) wide back and front. The first principal was Miss Daphne Smith from Gympie Central School.


In 1970 the school closed, a victim of better transport and larger centralised schools. The building was acquired by the Gympie and District Historical Society and relocated to its present site at the museum. It is furnished with the old-fashioned desks and long forms. The walls, as in older days, are hung with maps and charts. One of the charts causing much interest is the 'Good Manners' chart. There is an exhibit of ink and inkwells along with slates, which is now unknown to the current generation of students. There are books and other teaching aids on exhibit to give an idea of the furnishings of former small country schools.



MR. KILHAM, Inspector of Schools, has been engaged during the week making his official examination at the Clermont and Copperfield Primary Schools. Mr. Fletcher, the head teacher, informs us that he has under his care in Clermont about eighty children now on the books. By this it will be seen that the number is increasing, while in Copperfield it is stated the attendance at the school has decreased during the past twelve months. This in the case of Copperfield can be easily accounted for, as a large number of families have lately left the district, owing to the depressed state of the mine, which we trust is only temporary.

From various sources we learn that the country for miles round is now just commencing to show the beneficial effects of the late showers, which have caused a fine spring in the grass. On the Aramac road we are informed that many of the creeks are now running. This will be welcomed by teamsters and others, who had to turn their horses and cattle out for a spell, because owing to the high price and scarcity of corn they could not afford to keep their cattle at work during the dry weather.

Mr. Saunders, the manager of Messrs. Lea and Mullin's crushing machine, Clermont, has, since his return from Ravenswood, been employed making several necessary improvements in connection with the mill. Most noticeable, is the arrangement for filtering the water after it has left the machine, and which * Some changes have recently taken place in our primary schools.
