

- Using Libraries and Archives more effectively

## Why It Isn't All Online

- Still print publications in libraries
- Still manuscript/archival records in archives
- Information in microform or CD formats
- Might be handwritten card indexes
- Cost to digitise money & time
- Only the most popular items online



# Hazards of Not Getting the Whole Story

 Some people only use the indexes – don't get the document/certificate

 Index is bare info only – more details are on the original record

 Can make the difference between researching the wrong person/family or creating brickwalls





## Oral History and Sound

The Oral History and Sound collection is part of the Alexander Turnbull Library.

There are more than 10,000 recordings in the collection. Recordings include interviews with people from throughout New Zealand and the Pacific, of various ethnicities, iwi (tribe) and hapū (sub-tribe), occupations, political affiliations and interests. Talks, readings and events are also covered.

Most of the collection has been recorded since the 1960s. The collection covers New Zealand society, culture, community, and political history from the late 19th century to the present.

Interviews usually have accompanying documentation, including an abstract – a detailed time-coded index providing quick access to the contents of the recording. A few interviews are fully or partially transcribed. Photographs and other relevant material are sometimes included.

There are Māori oral history projects and recordings of talks, lectures and other events in te reo Māori.

### NZ Cemeteries Collection

Since 1967 The New Zealand Society of Genealogists has produced cemetery transcriptions for approx. 1400 cemeteries nationwide. Dates range between 1812 through to 2014. Most municipal cemeteries are included, but a significant proportion of this collection includes private cemeteries, Maori Urupa and remote burial locations.

The full collection is held at the NZSG Library at 159 Queens Road Panmure, Auckland. For details on what is available search the Library Catalogue: Search the Library>>>

Transcriptions between1812 – 2007 are available either on microfiche at most public libraries or in digital format on Ancestry.com. For a listing of what information is available via these two mediums download:

#### Cemetery websites

There are a significant number of websites devoted to information about Cemeteries both here in New Zealand and elsewhere in the world. Increasingly, we are seeing websites that include photographs of graves. A simple Google search by location will inevitably bring up a positive result.

Council databases are likely to be the most up-to-date. For those who have an idea of burial location, we recommend the website **KiwiCelts**. This website has a Geneamap which provides the co-ordinates for places of interest to Genealogists and Historians such as Churches, Cemeteries, Museums, and Memorials. It also provides direct links with Council websites and their Cemetery Databases. Search KiwiCelts either by cemetery name or by geographical location: <u>KiwiCelts>>></u>

As researchers know, we often commence our research without certain knowledge of either family names, or the location in which they lived. In such circumstances this resource comes into its own.






Petane (now Bay View) was the site of an ambush by colonial forces which killed 12 Pai Mārire supporters on 12 October 1866. Today Bay View serves the local farming and market gardening community and is near to popular beaches and picnic areas along the Esk River

### Meaning of place name

Named after the view of Hawke Bay it affords. Formerly known as Petane, the Māori form of the biblical 'Bethany'. The name was changed to avoid confusion with Petone. The original Māori name was Kaiarero.






