The State Records Office holds records that have been transferred from the Education Department of Western Australia (as well as predecessor and related agencies) and from individual government schools.

Education Department

A small population, economic uncertainties, and denominational rivalries mitigated against the development of a comprehensive education system in Western Australia during the early years of the Colony. It was not until 1847 that the first education authority, the General Board of Education, was established to oversee the development of the Colony's schools. The General Board of Education established a secular Girls' School and a Boys' School



in Perth, opened government assisted schools in rural districts, and provided subsidies to Roman Catholic schools in the Colony.

Student Admission Cards

Admission cards record the name of the student, the date of admission, the date of birth, the name and occupation of parent/guardian and religious denomination.

Student Admission Registers

These registers were often used prior to the introduction of student admission cards. They record the student's name, the date of admission, the date of birth, residence, place of birth, the school last attended, the standard last passed, the name of the parent/guardian, the date of withdrawal from school, the reason for withdrawal, the standard passed and to what school removed.

School Journals

School journals are the headmaster's/headmistress's diary of events and activity at the school.

Inspector's Reports

Inspector's Reports are a record of the District Superintendent's summary of the standard of the school. Inspections were usually made on a twice-yearly basis.

Punishment Books

Punishment books are a record of punishment (eg. reprimand, caning) meted out to students. They record the name of the student, the date, the amount and instrument of punishment, by whom administered and additional remarks.

Staff Records

Registers and <u>record of service cards</u> for both teaching and non-teaching staff employed by the Education Department are available for the period 1892 to 1970.

Rules for teachers 1872 & 1915

- My favourite 1872
- Any teacher who smokes, uses liquor in any form, frequents pool or public halls or gets shaved in a barber shop will give good reason to suspect his worth, intention, integrity and honesty.
- My favourites for females 1915
- You may not ride in carriages or automobiles with any man except your father or brother.
- You may under no circumstances dye your hair.

Pupil Records

- Admission/pupil registers
 - Name
 - Date of birth
 - Father's name and occupation
 - Residence
 - Religion
 - Start and finish dates
- Corporal punishment registers

Corporal punishment registers were kept by the head teacher of each school and record all corporal punishment administered by the head Teacher or an assistant (authorised by the minister).

The corporal punishment register contains the following information for each entry: date, name of the pupil or pupils receiving corporal punishment, fault or incident requiring punishment and the kind and extent of punishment.

Corporal punishment was to be administered not for trivial breaches of school discipline, but rather only as a last resort when the student had committed offences against morality, gross impertinence, and/or wilful and persistent disobedience. Girls over the age of twelve were not to receive corporal punishment.







OUR SCHOOLS.

In the matter of schools, our district is not ill provided. In order to meet the requirements of Geraldton it has been found necessary, from time to time, to increase the size of the various schools, and this has culminated in the erection of a large Government school house for boys and girls. It is built of white peak stone, and when we state that the masonry is in the hands of Mr. Alex. Stewart, it means that the work will be of a most substantial kind. The masonry will be finished in about three months. It is gratifying to be able to state that the scoools are in the hands of most efficient teachers. Mr. A. Carson, the lately appointed master of the Government school, is giving general satisfaction, and is a painstaking teacher. The girls' school, under charge of Miss Strappini, a long tried and accomplished teacher, maintains a large and regular attendance, and is bringing about good results. The assisted school is on a more permanent footing since its charge has devolved on Miss Kelly and her sister, and the attendance has greatly increased and been more regular.

There are also, in Geraldton, two private schools for ladies, which meet with such support as a limited population can afford. The higher accomplishments are taught by the ladies who have established them, and parents who object to mixed schools for their children have the opportunity to keep them select. The District School Board is endeavoring to open branch schools in the country, but there is some difficulty in obtaining suitable buildings or school rooms; the population is also very scattered, and the aid given by Government is small. The schools at Northampton, one a government, and the other an assisted one, are well attended. I am informed that the attendance at the assisted school, under the management of the Misses M'Auliffe, is sixty, and that since the advent of Mr. Hasleby, the master of the Government school, the children have greatly improved. A proper school house at Northampton is much needed, the present building, a rented one, being in a bad state of repair, and altogether unsuitable. The schools at Northampton are under the control and supervision of the Geraldton District

Board of Education, thirty six miles distant; it must be very inconvenient and expensive for members of the board to travel all that distance to visit a school, and I think that it would be an advantage to the district if a subboard was appointed until such time as Northampton is declared a municipality and has local institutions of its own.

MEADOWCROFT v. WILDING.

The plaintiff in this case was the Rev. D. Meadowcroft, minister of the Congregational Church of this city, the defendant being Mr. Thomas Wilding, a well-known farmer formerly residing at Northam. The action was brought to recover damages, in consequence of the defendant having removed from the private school kept by Mrs. Meadowcroft his three daughters, without having given a quarters notice, pursuant to agreement. The defendant pleaded, in defence, that his daughters, while at school, and boarding with the plaintiff and his wife, were treated in a harsh and cruel manner. they had not been provided with clean and sufficient board and lodging, that they were employed as nursemaids to the plaintiff's children and called upon to perform sundry menial offices, that they were dressed raggedly and dirtily, and that when one of them was ill the plaintiff refused to place her

about a month. My children and most of the boarders, including the Wildings, were troubled with lice in their head. Most children at their age are so troubled. I made every effort, by frequent application of the small-toth comb, to get rid of the vermin, but the Wildings were never asked to perform that operation on my own children.

Miss Annie Smith, who was engaged as assistant teacher at Mrs. Meadowcroft's school, sail that she never knew any of Mr. Wilding's daughters being kept away from school, in or er to perform household work; they were kept strictly to their duties. They never complained to the witness of the treatment they received at the hands of the Meadowcrofts, nor had witness even noticed any cause for complaint. She never saw them engaged in any menial occupation.

In cross-examication witness said that no doubt the children had lice in their heads; most children have, "and "—continued the witness addressing the Attorney General—"when you come to have any, you will find that it is so."

The proceedings terminated with cheers for the Rev. Mr. McCarlie and Mr. Bennet, and for Mr. Hill, the head teacher. and his assistants.









George was instructed to to take charge of Wiseman's Ferry Public School in April 1881

On 13th August 1881 George gave the Welcoming Speech to Prince Albert Victor & Prince George Edward on their visit to Wiseman's Ferry.

George Bernard Crabbe commenced and opened Camden Grammar School in July 1886 and he and his family became very popular in the district.

George and Isabella had three children during their marriage. On 12th November 1894 the first public school in Coolgardie, Western Australia, with George B. Crabbe as its first head master, was officially opened

He died on 21 June 1896 in Coolgardie, Western Australia, at the age of 49, and was buried there.
