
During the late 18th and 19th centuries, large numbers of convicts were transported to the various Australian penal colonies by the British government, many for petty crimes they were driven to commit because of the poverty they were forced to live in.^[1] One of the primary reasons for the British settlement of Australia was the establishment of a penal colony to alleviate pressure on their overburdened correctional facilities. Over the 80 years more than 165,000 convicts were transported to Australia.^[2] The number of convicts pales, however, compared to the immigrants who arrived in Australia in the 1851-1871 gold rush. In 1852 alone, 370,000 immigrants arrived in Australia and by 1871 the total population had trebled from 430,000 to 1.7 million people.^[3] The last convicts to be transported to Australia arrived in Western Australia in 1868.



Ireland-Australia transportation database

The National Archives of Ireland holds a wide range of records relating to the <u>transportation</u> of convicts from Ireland to Australia covering the period 1788 to 1868. In some cases these include records of members of convicts' families transported as <u>free</u> <u>settlers</u>.

To mark the Australian Bicentenary in 1988, the Taoiseach presented microfilms of the most important of these records to the Government and People of Australia as a gift from the Government and People of Ireland. A computerised index to the records was prepared with the help of IBM and is available for use at various locations in Australia.

While the collection of <u>convict petitions</u> dates from the beginning of transportation from Ireland to Australia in 1791, all transportation registers compiled before 1836 were destroyed in the Four Courts fire of June 1922. Therefore, if the person you are researching was convicted before 1836, but was not the subject of a petition, he or she will not appear on this database. In other words, the records from which the transportation database was compiled such as the <u>transportation registers</u>, convict reference files and petitions to government for pardon or commutation of sentence, are incomplete.





On Thursday an inquest was likewise held at the "Black Dog" public-bouse, Cambridgestreet, Rocks, on the body of Richard Walker, who the preceding morning, between 9 and 10 o'clock, fall to the earth in the yard at the back of the house in which he lived in the above strept. He was carried to bed speechless, and remained in that state until about four o'clock the same day. The tury returned a verdict of-" Died by the visitat on of God." In the course of the examination of witrespect, it appeared that a man of the name of Thomas Mosher, a poor cobbler living in the same house with deceased, went, between two and three o'clock, to the shop of Surgeon Hosking, and requested his attendance to the deceased, who had grown worse. Upon being informed that the applicant had no pecuntary means of remunerating him, Surgeon H. declined attending, alleging his "business would not permit him." At this conduct the jury, one and all, expressed their indicnation in the severest terms language could conver ; as it was their unanimous opinion, that had the assistance required been aff eded to the individual now dead, in all probability he would have recovered ; and this their opinion they requested the Curaner to represent through the proper medium.

Original Correspondence.

To the Editor of the Sydney Gazette. Sta, -- I cannot allow the aspersion thrown out against my professional character in your report of the Coroner's inquest held on the body of Richard Walker, which appeared in your last Gazette, to pass without notice-especially as I consider no Coroner's Jury have a right to call is question the motives of any medical man for not doing what they may consider to be his duty.

In the first place, I have to state, that although the applicant had no pseuniary means of remunerating me, as stated at the inquest, had it been otherwise, I could not have gone at that time to visit the person, having but a few moments returned from a patient whom I could not have left for any length of time. Finding I was engaged, why could not the messenger have sought other medical assistance [and, messever, it would have been useless had I gone, as I have heard since that the man was dead before he returned home.



Introduction

The Swan River Settlement had been in existence for twenty years when it took the unusual step of electing to become a British penal settlement in 1849. Eager Home authorities accepted the offer and quickly dispatched the barque *Scindian*, which arrived in Gage Roads on the 1st June 1850 with a cargo of 75 male convicts aboard. This was to be the first of 43 shipments of convicts to the colony over an 18 year period.



Although a total of 9,925 convicts were officially transported during this period, it is estimated that some 500 of these were local

Convicts as referred to in this PROV*guide* are those people convicted of an offence in Britain, or a British colony, whose sentence was to be transported to New South Wales, Tasmania or Western Australia. Transportation officially ceased in New South Wales and Tasmania in 1853 and in Western Australia in 1868. Strictly speaking, no convicts were transported directly to the Port Phillip District of New South Wales. However convicts did find their way to the District, and this generally happened in one of three ways: a convict from Sydney could be assigned to a work gang in Port Phillip; a ticket of leave holder might enter Port Phillip from either New South Wales or Tasmania to work and was required to register with the authorities; or the convict may have been an Exile.

A select list of records relating to Exiles

Exiles were people who had been convicted of an offence in Britain and were serving their sentence in an English prison, and who were then transported to the Australian colonies. Certain prisoners, depending on their crime, who were seen as being well behaved while serving the early part of their sentence were given an option of being sent to the Australian colonies, and on arrival being given a conditional pardon. The condition of the pardon was that the person remained in the colony for the duration of the unexpired part of their sentence. In effect they were exiled to Australia.
