

George Bishop Causeway

1853 - 1911

Up until the late 1890's Toorbul could only be accessed by boat. To the west, Toorbul was bounded by a tidal area with "waste deep" mud that provided an effective barrier to road.

Eventually growth within the district highlighted the need for a road connection across the tidal flats. Local identity Mr George Bishop and his sons were commissioned around 1900 to construct a causeway and paid the sum of £40.

It is unclear if the money was equally contributed by four local residents, Mr George Bishop, Mr N. Freeman, Mr John Carnegie and one other unidentified resident or whether a formal contract was entered into with the Caboolture logs were still in place and in good order. District Board, a forerunner of Caboolture Shire Council.

George Bishop commenced the task by cutting tea-tree logs and laying them side by side across the mud to form a base for the road. This style of construction was not uncommon with the end product known as corduroy road.

Drains were dug along both sides of the tea-tree base, with the material being used as a fill on top of the logs. Hollow logs were used to cater for tidal water movement.

The road was completed by carting in additional soil by horse and dray.

While the construction technique was simple, it was effective. Up until 1958 there were reports from residents that the tea-tree



Why the surname change?

JOHN CARNEGIE was brought up at the Central Police Court yesterday, charged with assaulting William Hays, a cab-driver, in Edwardstreet, on Wednesday, at 11 p.m. It appears that Hays was standing in the street outside Dinsdale's Hotel, when a quarrel took place between him and the defendant, in the course of which Carnegie struck Hays on the face with an old worn-out chisel. He inflicted a cut over the eye. On hearing the evidence, the Police Magistrate found Carnegie guilty, and sentenced him to two months' imprisonment.



- ▶ 1885 John Carnegie approx 1,000 bags, Jones 1,000 bags, Hamilton Brothers 3,000 bags, Tripcony 200 bags, MBO Coy 500, Turner 1,000 bags, Freeman 500 bags

Oyster Cultivation @ Bribie



- Opal mining Eulo, Thargomindah
- ▶ 1899 Ellen first arrested for drunkenness in Brisbane, 1 month's imprisonment or £2 fine
- Further terms of imprisonment in 1899 followed for drunkenness, obscene language and creating a disturbance, drunkenness and obscene language in 1901 and into 1902 for similar offences

Ellen's Story continued

- Nov 1902 released from Toowoomba Prison
- 1904 arrested for vagrancy in Barcaldine under name of Ellen Chick alias Ferguson, 3 months imprisonment
- Living with Charles Wademore Chick, opal miner
- ▶ 1925 Alexander Miller Ferguson dies
- ▶ 1927 marries Charles Wademore Chick
- 1929 Chick dies in Parramatta, NSW
- ▶ 1946 Ellen dies in Brisbane

James Carnegie, Helen/Ellen's son

- Not mentioned in his grandparents' wills or on their death certificates
- Not mentioned on his mother's death certificate
- His mother's will left everything to Clara Bishop or if she predeceased Helen, then it was to go to her nephew John Carnegie Davis
- Helen's funeral notice simply states 'beloved sister of Mrs CS Bishop'
- Did Ellen/Helen want nothing to do with her son OR did James want nothing to do with his mother?

Clara's Story

- ▶ 1889 married Charles Brandon Davis
- ▶ 1891purchased Portion 49V Parish of Toorbul, adjacent to John Carnegie
- ▶ 1893 Charles went to Sydney
- 1894 Charles was in Melbourne on his way to WA goldfields
- Love letter home Oct 1894 advising he had caught fever at Coolgardie, recovering in Fremantle
- Last letter Dec 1894 from Fremantle saying he was going back to the goldfields

Love Letters

- the last paragraph Dec 1894

If Alick Ferguson wants my address you can always give him the one you have got from me if he wants to write to me I hope him & Nellie are quite well & your mother father & Jim Give them all my kind love & I hope you all have a Merry Xmas & a Happy New Year Kiss the two boys for me & tell them when Daddy comes home he will bring them lots of nice things when he comes if they are good boys I must now conclude with kindest love to you & the two boys from your loving hubby Charley

Clara's story continued

- 1895 newspaper notice Clara believed deceased was her husband but no confirmation from police
- 1910 Clara again contacted WA police, again unsuccessful
- 1915 Clara requested search for his death from Registrar BDMs WA, also contacted his relatives in England who had not heard from him since 1893
- 1915 filed for probate to obtain possession of his land Portion 49V
- Clara had also bought Portions 46V, 48V and 52V

A GOLDFIELDS MYSTERY. SUPPOSED SUICIDE.

The dead body of a man with the throat cut was found about 150 yards from the Co lgardie road, three miles out from Southern Cross, by a teamster named William Hughes, on Friday last. The body, which was partly dress d, appeared to be that of a man about thirty years od It was lying on its back, with a folded tent under the head, a d a razor was found alongside it. From appearance it is thought to be a case of suicide. The body was much decomposed, and must have been dead bout a month. The features were unrecognisable. Among the effects the only clue a present to identification is a letter from Beachport beaded "My dear son," and signed "Your aff ctionate father, Thomas Davis."

1895

Brisbane.—Charles Davis is charged, on warrant issued by the Brisbane Bench, with having, on the 10th February last, deserted his child, John Carnegie, residing at Toombul. Description:—A seaman or wharf labourer, an Englishman, 31 years of age, 5 feet 4 inches high, stout build, blue eyes, brown beard and hair, fair complexion, strong fair moustache, bald spots under chin, deformed nail on the middle finger of one hand. Supposed to have gone to Western Australia.—O. 841. 21st May, 1894.

Sewn In A Sail

A story is told which illustrates the unbreakable spirit of our early pioneers. The words are few and simple, yet the story contains deep sorrow, resolute determination and a fortitude of spirit which is felt rather than written.

The story is told by a niece who lived for some time in one of Mrs Clara Bishop's cottages at Toorbul and heard it

first hand from her aunt. Several old residents of Toorbul remember the tragic happening.

Clara Carnegie's first marriage was to a Mr. Davis, about whom little is known. They had two sons, Alec and John (Jack). When the "Black Flu" as described by Ernie Bonney claimed its victims soon after World War 1, it reached into the isolated settlements along Pumicestone Passage. Alec Davis died of the "Black Flu".

Then, and this is reported from several sources, the authorities in Caboolture refused to handle the body unless it

was closely wrapped to guard against contagion.

Clara Davis sewed her son's body in a sail. She drove a spring cart along the bush track into Caboolture in the dead of night and left the body in Carmody's buggy shed to await a doctor's certificate.

In those days the buggy shed served as a morgue more than once, but that night it must have covered human grief and human courage beyond mortal measure.

- ▶ 1915 Clara married George Edwin (Ned) Bishop
- Clara was 42 and Ned was 30, a bachelor
- No issue from the marriage
- Ned died 1942, only 57 years, buried in Caboolture cemetery
- Clara died 1960 at the age of 87 years, buried in Lutwyche cemetery


