- Standards

- It's not all online!

Standards

- Work backwards from the known (yourself) to the unknown (forebears)
- Never believe everything on BDM certificates
- Never trust the spelling of surnames, place names etc
- Always check given name/surname variants
- Always have at least 2 separate sources of proof for each event
- Everything is only speculation until verified
- Scan certificates & important documents - keep originals in a safe place
- If a document exists, read it!
- Join at least one family history group, genealogical society or historical society
- Share your information and documentation (copies only) with other researchers

Genealogical Proof Standard

- A reasonably exhaustive search for all pertinent information
- A complete and accurate citation to the source of each item used
- Analysis of the collected information's quality as evidence
- Resolution of any conflicting or contradictory evidence
- Arrive at a soundly reasoned, coherently written conclusion

Mr. A. R. Spencer, aged 83, one of Brisbane's oldest practising dentists, died at his home, Logan Road, Stone's Corner, yesterday morning. He is survived by his widow.

Mr. Spencer had been in practice as a dentist for 42 years in Brisbane. He was a foundation member and past president of the Amateur Fishermen's Association, and a past commodore of the South Brisbane Sailing Club. He continued his work until last Christmas Eve, but had since been confined to his bed.

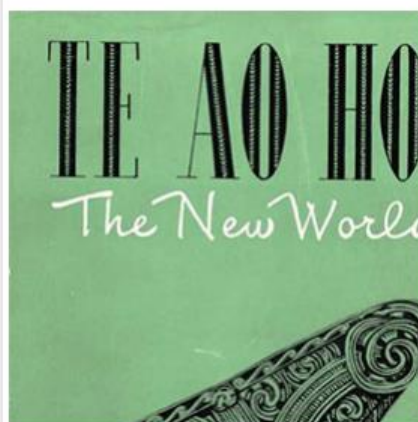

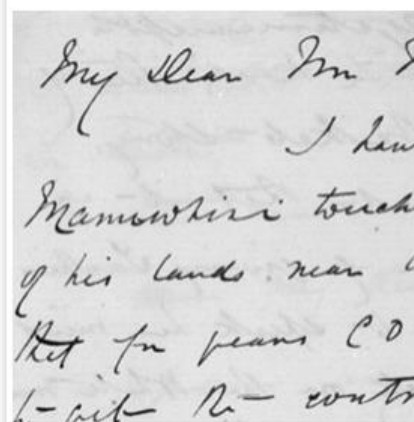

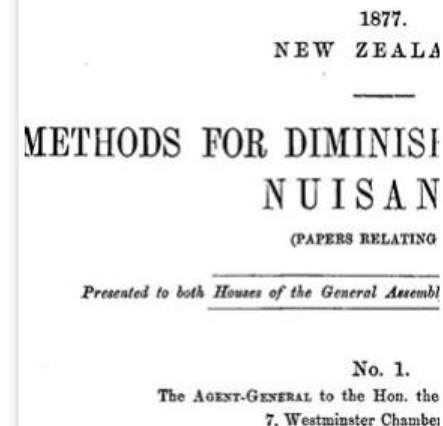

Life Events

A life event is something that changes things in your life. This could be locating records for a birth, death or marriage in Australia or overseas. It could be trying to discover if a will existed or whether someone was in an institution. It might be trying to trace an adoption. If you are looking for any of these events then life events is where you can find the guides and resources you need to get started.

Adoption records

Legal adoption started at different times in different states. Records began around the early 1920s. There is advice on how to access and locate adoption records. It includes Aboriginal and Torres Strait peoples adoptions and overseas adoptions. State Library of Queensland holds resources that are useful when placing and tracing the parties to an adoption.

History of the region during World War I

Enlistment

With the outbreak of war in Europe in August 1914 the Australian Government committed the nation to supporting Britain and its allies in the defeat of the German aggressor. To meet this obligation the Australian army required rapid expansion and did this by calling for volunteers. Men flocked to enlist, but initially entry requirements were strict. The plan was to have half the contingent made up of men with experience, either already serving in the army, trained militiamen, or those with previous war service. The rest of the force was to be made up of physically fit volunteers between the ages of eighteen and thirty-five years who were five feet six inches and above. However, enlistments began to decline. With the news of the Gallipoli campaign there was again an upsurge in enlistments and meetings were held to encourage men to volunteer. The physical requirements were relaxed.

Alexander Thomas Davis was the son of Charles Brandon Davis and Clare Stanley Bishop (nee Carnegie). His father died in 1894 and his mother married George Edwin Bishop in 1915. He was single, a fisherman and living with his mother & stepfather at Toorbul when he died in October 1916. Alexander Thomas suffered a severe head injury during battle resulting in a depressed fracture and laceration to the brain. He returned to Australia in 1918.

Archival research terms

Record—information of permanent and historic value, often in paper-based form (e.g. a letter, photograph, a map), but can also be a CD, a film or a digital file

Item—a single record or many records, e.g. an item may be a single architectural drawing, a 500-page leather-bound book, or a bundle of correspondence (letters, telegrams, reports)

Series—a group of related items created, received, or used in the same activity

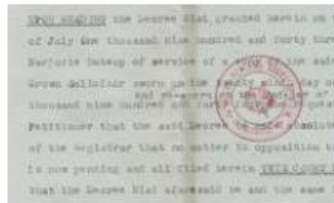

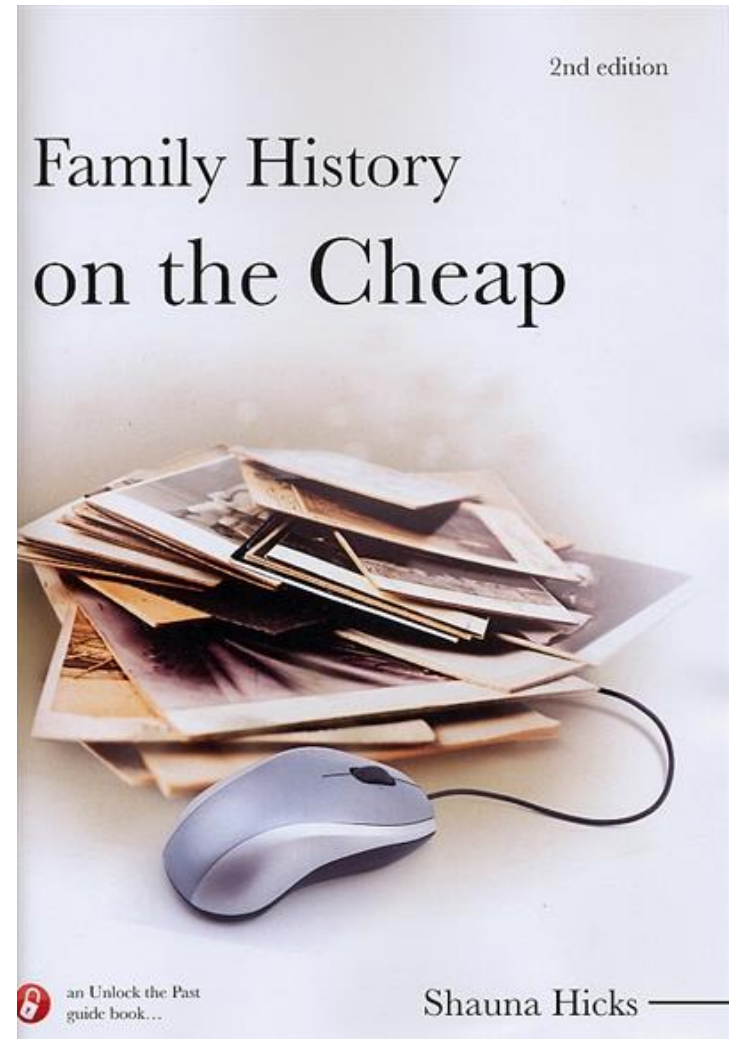

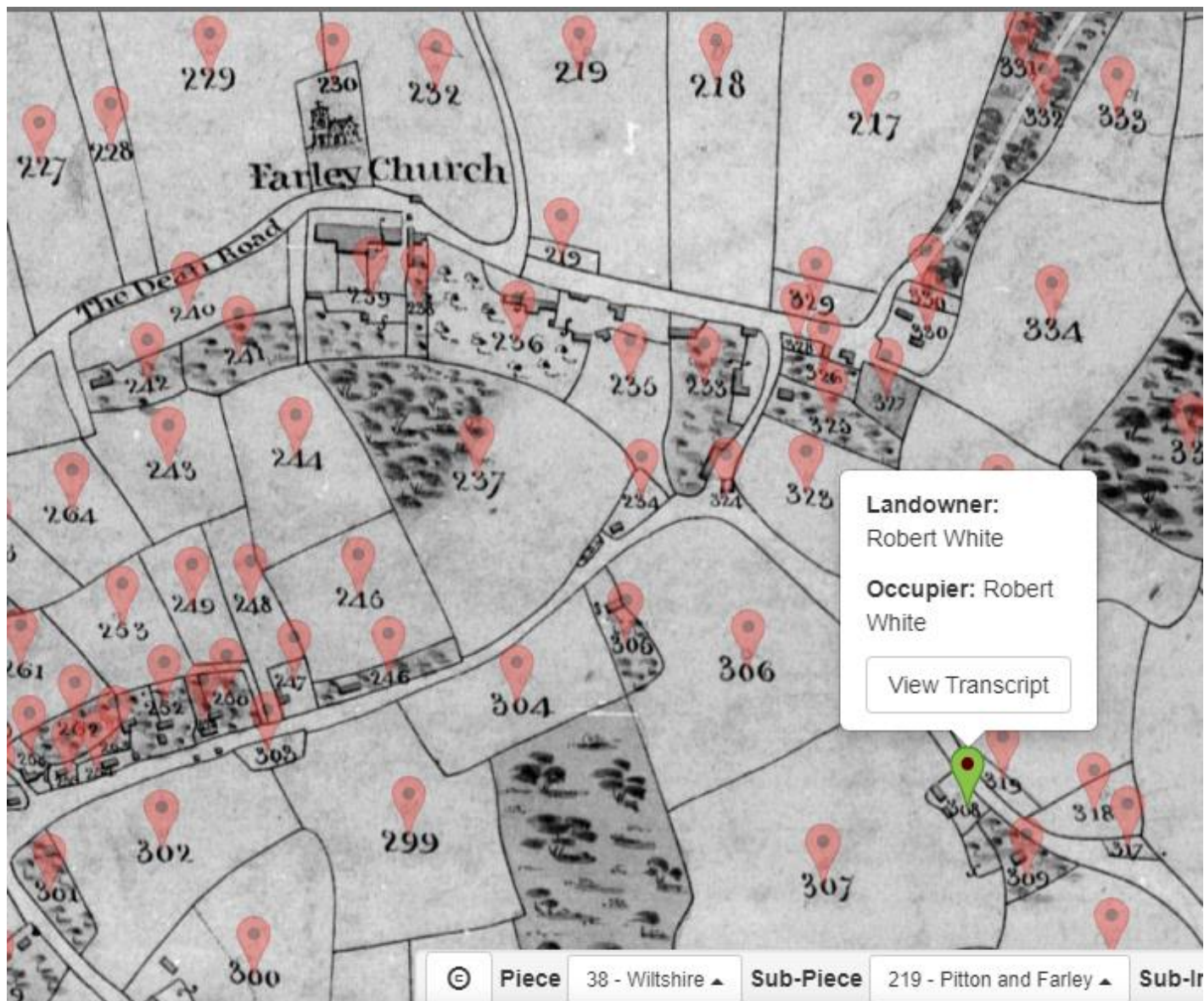
Tithe Records

Some wounded men having been out in front of the firing line near FARM de MOQUET for several days, a party under Private ANDERSON volunteered to go up from ALBERT, a distance of four (4) miles and try and bring them in. This they did having to make their way for a long distance over ground and through caps that were being shelled heavily by the enemy. With much trouble in the darkness they located the men in NO MAN'S LAND near the enemy's trenches & brought them back to safety over ground that was being swept by our own guns and then over the ground being bombarded by the enemy.
