There has been rather a diminution of the population in the more landward parts of the parish, in consequence of the demolition of many cottages and hamlets; and it is principally in the fishing villages that the increase has taken place. Several of those families, also, who were removed from their cottages, instead of leaving the parish, found a residence on Rossie island, adjoining to the town of Montrose, and which portion of the parish, as now included within the burgh of Montrose by the boundary bill, will, in a few years, become a sort of suburban appendage to that town.



THE town of Montrose, a royal and parliamentary burgh lying on a peninsular piece of land at the mouth of the South Esk, 30 miles north-east of Dundee, is a seaport, and a seat of the Flaxspinning trade. The building of ships and boats, besides other industries pertaining to a seaport town, is largely engaged in. Bleaching is likewise carried on in the vicinity. The South Esk is spanned at Montrose by two bridges—the Suspension Bridge, 432 feet long, built in 1829, and the North British Railway Bridge, built in 1881. The Harbour comprises the reach of the South Esk below the Suspension Bridge, and is deep and well-sheltered, and there is a considerable amount of shipping frequenting the port. The town has some handsome buildings, also monuments of Sir Robert Peel and Joseph Hume, and presents a busy appearance. Its population at the last census was close upon 15,000. The village of Hillside lies partly in Montrose parish and partly in Logie-Pert.

Immediately opposite Montrose, on the south bank of the river, stands the fishing village of Ferryden, having a population of over 1500, situated in the parish of Craig, which parish also includes the village of Usan and the island of Inchbrayock. The parish of Dun lies on the north side of the river, between Montrose and Brechin, and has a population of 541. Bridge of Dun railway station is




Execution broadside, 1832.

An Account of the Behaviour, Confession and Execution of John Howism, who was executed at Edinburgh, this morning, Saturday, the 21st January, 1852, for the Inhuman Murder of an old Woman, in her own house, at Cramond.

E DINBURGH, 21st January, 1832.—It will be recollected, that the unfortunate man, should at the very moment that other two unfortunate man. Governd Beveridge, were suffering the last penalty of the law, in this city, for a similar crime, committed mander, in a very brund and harberous manner, so the person of a very integerst and industrious old woman, at Crimond, within five miles of Edinburgh, by cutting her face, with a garden apade, down and across has feer, which had it tully open, in a shocking manner, even in broad day-light. He was brought in the next day, the 3d of December last, after considerable resistance on his part, on a care, ried 1 and, after several examinations before the Shoriff, was fully committed for trial.

He was accordingly tried, before the High Court of Justiciary, on the last day of the year, fistorday, 31st Decamber, 1831, and, after an interesting and impartial trial, which fasted from ten on Saturday morning, till after three on Sabbath morning, was unanimously found Guilty of Murder as libelled. A plea of insamity was urged in defence, but which was rejected on the medical evidence, as well as un other evidence. Therefore, after a serious admoration, and a most feeling caborration, from the presiding Judge, the Lord Justice Clerk, Boyle, sentenced to be executed at Edinburgh, on Saturday the 21st January, 1832, and his body to be given to Dr Muuro, of the University, for dissection.

Several persons obtained permission to visit him since his condemantion, in order to antisfy clarmed ex as to his sanity; of course, there were various apinious formed. The most prevalent opinion, however, by all those who had the best oppermutities of forming any, correctly, was, that the more was seen of him, the more he seemed to be perfectly asset; and he even apurned the very idea of his being, in any manner whatever, considered issues. He positively desired having committed the crime for which he was about to suffer, saying.—" That no person ever saw him do it." He was a great gormandiser when he could get it, and considered good living every thing to be wished for He condaidered himself to be particularly attached to the Society of Christian Friends, commonly called Quakers, though it is well known he naver was admitted a member of that respectable association.
