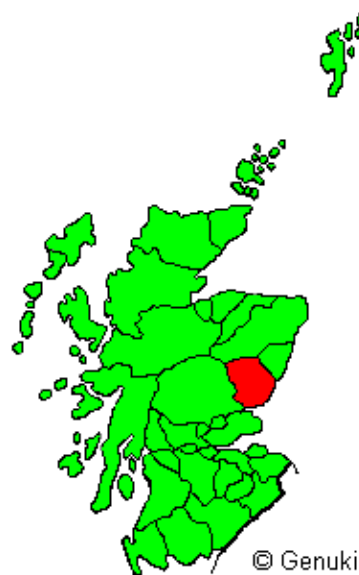

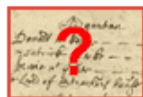

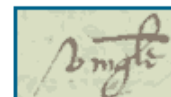

There has been rather a diminution of the population in the more landward parts of the parish, in consequence of the demolition of many cottages and hamlets; and it is principally in the fishing villages that the increase has taken place. Several of those families, also, who were removed from their cottages, instead of leaving the parish, found a residence on Rossie island, adjoining to the town of Montrose, and which portion of the parish, as now included within the burgh of Montrose by the boundary bill, will, in a few years, become a sort of suburban appendage to that town.

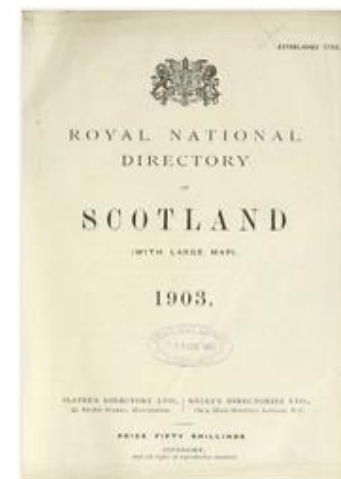
Vol 1936-37: The Post-Office annual Glasgow

MONTROSE,

Including the Parishes and Villages of CRAIG, DUN, FERRYDEN, LOGIE-PERT, and MARYTON.

THE town of Montrose, a royal and parliamentary burgh lying on a peninsular piece of land at the mouth of the South Esk, 30 miles north-east of Dundee, is a seaport, and a seat of the Flaxspinning trade. The building of ships and boats, besides other industries pertaining to a seaport town, is largely engaged in. Bleaching is likewise carried on in the vicinity. The South Esk is spanned at Montrose by two bridges—the Suspension Bridge, 432 feet long, built in 1829, and the North British Railway Bridge, built in 1881. The Harbour comprises the reach of the South Esk below the Suspension Bridge, and is deep and well-sheltered, and there is a considerable amount of shipping frequenting the port. The town has some handsome buildings, also monuments of Sir Robert Peel and Joseph Hume, and presents a busy appearance. Its population at the last census was close upon 15,000. The village of Hillside lies partly in Montrose parish and partly in Logie-Pert.

Immediately opposite Montrose, on the south bank of the river, stands the fishing village of Ferryden, having a population of over 1500, situated in the parish of Craig, which parish also includes the village of Usan and the island of Inchbrayock. The chief seats in Craig parish are Rossie, Dunninald, and Usan. Population of Craig parish, 2,500.

The parish of Dun lies on the north side of the river, between Montrose and Brechin, and has a population of 541. Bridge of Dun railway station is located in this parish.

The parish of Logie-Pert comprehends the district to the south-east of Montrose, and includes the villages of Logie, Craigo, and Muirside. Population of parish about 1,000.

Maryton parish to the south and west of Montrose has a population of 300.

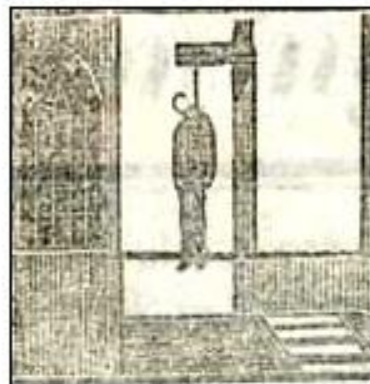

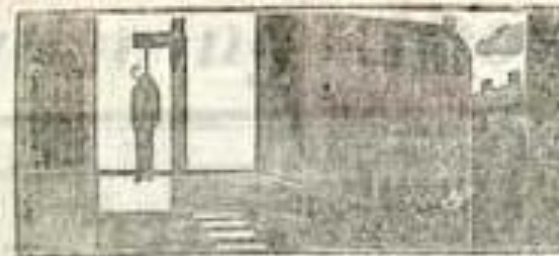

An Account of the Behaviour, Confession and Execution of *John Howison*, who was executed at Edinburgh, this morning, Saturday, the 21st January, 1832, for the Inhuman Murder of an old Woman, in her own house, at Cramond.

EDINBURGH, 21st January, 1832.—It will be recollected, that this unhappy man, almost at the very moment that other two unfortunate men, Goss and Beveridge, were suffering the last penalty of the law, in this city, for a similar crime, committed murder, in a very brutal and barbarous manner, on the person of a very innocent and industrious old woman, at Cramond, within five miles of Edinburgh, by cutting her face, with a garden spade, down and across her face, which laid it fully open, in a shocking manner, even in broad day-light. He was brought in the next day, the 3d of December last, after considerable resistance on his part, on a cart, tied; and, after several examinations before the Sheriff, was fully committed for trial.

He was accordingly tried, before the High Court of Justiciary, on the last day of the year, Saturday, 31st December, 1831, and, after an interesting and impartial trial, which lasted from ten on Saturday morning, till after three on Sabbath morning, was unanimously found Guilty of Murder as libelled. A plea of insanity was urged in defence, but which was rejected on the medical evidence, as well as on other evidence. Therefore, after a serious admonition, and a most feeling exhortation, from the presiding Judge, the Lord Justice Clerk, Boyle, sentenced to be executed at Edinburgh, on Saturday the 21st January, 1832, and his body to be given to Dr Monro, of the University, for dissection.

Several persons obtained permission to visit him since his condemnation, in order to satisfy themselves as to his sanity; of course, there were various opinions formed. The most prevalent opinion, however, by all those who had the best opportunities of forming any, correctly, was, that the more was seen of him, the more he seemed to be perfectly sane; and he even spurned the very idea of his being, in any manner whatever, considered insane. He positively denied having committed the crime for which he was about to suffer, saying—"That no person ever saw him do it." He was a great gourmandiser when he could get it, and considered good living every thing to be wished for. He considered himself to be particularly attached to the Society of Christian Friends, commonly called Quakers, though it is well known he never was admitted a member of that respectable association.

In the centuries before there were newspapers and 24-hour news channels, the general public had to rely on street literature to find out what was going on. The most popular form of this for nearly 300 years was 'broadside' - the tabloids of their day. Sometimes pinned up on walls in houses and ale-houses, these single sheets carried public notices, news, speeches and songs that could be read (or sung) aloud.

The National Library of Scotland's online collection of nearly 1,800 broadsides lets you see for yourself what 'the word on the street' was in Scotland between 1650 and 1910. Crime, politics, romance, emigration, humour, tragedy, royalty and superstitions - all these and more are here.

SALE OF A WIFE.

A full and particular Account of the Sale of a Woman, named Mary Mackintosh, which took place on Wednesday Evening, the 10th of July, 1828, in the Grass Market of Edinburgh, accused by her Husband of being a notorious Drunkard; with the Particulars of the bloody Battle which took place afterwards.

ON Wednesday evening last, in the Grass-market, Mary Mackintosh was brought down about six o'clock by her husband, for the purpose of being sold. Her crime was drunkenness and adultery, she was held by a stout man tied round her middle, and the words, - 'To be sold by public auction' in front of her bosom. Several thousand spectators were assembled to witness this novel occurrence. John P., a pensioner, and knight of the hammer, commenced business, but the enthusiasm of the people were so great, that no one could get a hearing for ten minutes, to bid for the unfortunate woman.

When the crowd got a little quiet the people began to examine the countenance of the woman; a Highland Drinker stepped through the crowd,
